Location:	LaSalle, Canoas, Brazil

Approximate Dates:	Dates to be confirmed, but usually held over July / August.
Brief Overview:	Seminars are usually offered from a variety of topics, including international law, criminal justice, restorative justice, international trade, critical race theory, decolonial theory, political philosophy, law and finance. This programme hosts a number of visiting professors from across the world, including Bergen University, Essex University (featuring Sociology & Criminology staff member Dr Phoebe Kisubi), Coimbra University and Coruña University. Classes take place on site at LaSalle University, Canoas, Brazil. SC389).

Who Can Apply?	All UG students but may be of particular interest to students on our political economy, media, and sexuality studies modules (e.g. SC233, SC389).
Application Process:	Applications are direct and will be via the website (once available).
